Board and staff of MOMOs are entitled to any On Co-op discounted "MOMO rate". (Note - members always get our best rates!) ○ MOMO status is granted only to co-op organizations. Individual members (i.e. customers) or any non co-op members are not entitled to the "MOMO rate". However, individuals or non co-ops may join On Co-op in a variety of membership categories, and take advantage of those benefits and privileges. Federations which join a non-federation category <u>cannot</u> grant MOMO status to their co-op members. ○ MOMO Example: Central 1 is an On Co-op member Federation. Alterna Savings, Libro Financial and First Ontario Credit Union are each considered MOMOs.
