Credit unions around the world share the same seven principles, as defined by the <u>International</u> <u>Co-operative Alliance</u>. These principles are guidelines by which co-operatives put their values into practice. Many credit unions articulate their values and concern for community through their corporate social responsibility reports, but don't consider the 7 Co-operative Principles in their operations.

The Financial Services Regulatory Authority of Ontario set out the Sound Business and Financial Practices Rule in 2022 that introduced a principles-based approach to business and financial practices for credit unions. <u>Rule 2: Co-operative Principles</u>, outlines that the board and senior management of a credit union are responsible for ensuring that the credit union is operated, managed, and governed in a manner consistent with co-operative principles.

- Reflection on the boards' role in operating within the principles.
